Essay 1: According to the author of the text, what is the role of young people in the climate change movement ?

Both the historic role played by young people in protest movements and the bottom-up strategy through which they tackle climate change should jumpstart a wave of climate policies: such is the thesis of the opinion piece under consideration.

First and foremost, it can seem quite paradoxical for young climate activists to be disregarded because of their age, for the youths have, more often than not, been at the heart of social movements. Indeed, the columnist sheds light on the precedents of the civil rights, the LGBTQ rights and the gun rights movements, in which young people's role was an undeniable turning point. Should the climate change movement repeat this pattern, young



people's hopelessness and demands for action cannot be left unheard.

Hence, young people want to make the most of all their tools: the social media era has created a new unique platform where all voices can be heard, a first step in a comprehensive bottom-up strategy. The urgency of the climate crisis calls for extraordinary measures and young people are gaining momentum in both national political landscapes and international summits. The wave of peaceful climate protests launched by Greta Thunberg's school strike has sparked a growing number of demands in the political and corporate field. Plus, this new generation is not limited to teens and highschoolers; it reaps the benefits of a shift in mindsets, notably with the election of Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, a <sup>young</sup> progressive congresswoman who has made climate change one of her top priorities.

All in all, young people have turned their fears into power to make a change.

It should be noted that young people are more and more invested in political and social issues, and they are hellbent on educating themselves, and others. Indeed, topics such as systemic racism, climate change or transphobia are fundamental and yet poorly (if hardly) taught. The youngsters leading the movements can easily be trusted, for their intentions as well as their

realizations are often well thought out. Not only are those issues a daily struggle for many, especially in the United States, but protesting and signing petitions are simple actions that can go a long way.
