Mais alors que beaucoup de travailleurs milléniaux veulent être indépendants financièrement à la cinquantaine, il est compliqué d'y parvenir - ça nécessitera la plupart du temps qu'ils mettent de côté 50 à 60 % de leur salaire. Les milléniaux, qui étaient nés entre 1981 et 1996, étaient entrés dans la vie active pendant la Grande Dépression et marquaient dans un monde dans lequel les critères traditionnels de richesse, tels que la propriété privée, sont inatteignables pour une plus grande partie d'entre eux comparé à ceux de la génération précédente.

Leurs comportements sont aussi modifiés, en partie, par l'incertitude : ils sont témoins de changements économiques majeurs alors même qu'ils tentent difficilement de se poser.

1- Should Charles III modernise the British monarchy?

About the British monarchy, Walter Bagehot said in the English Constitution (1867): "we must not let in daylight upon magic". Nevertheless, hasn't the knock-on aftermaths of the Queen's death deterred from that idea?

I would tend to agree with the view that

Charles III should modernise the British monarchy. It is so abundantly clear that the monarchy's image has been/tarnished over the years. For instance, when Harry and Meghan has blamed the royal family for being racist during an interview with Oprah Winfrey, it has had noxious aftermaths for the monarchy, let alone the Brexit. Additionally, one of the 100 Royals whose name I can't remember once said he does/not regret his friendship with Jeffrey Epstein which was a scandal and tarnished the monarchy's image even more. Accordingly, Charles III should come up with a new monarchy. Moreover, the monarchy is often said to be too aloof from the Brits 150 who wish for a less managed way of living/ from the Royals. Being too distant is also a critics to the monarchy. Fortunately, Blair managed to find the right words so as to convince Elizabeth II to have an address for Diana's death in 1997. Therefore, Charles III has to follow in Elizabeth's II 200 steps who has begun to level up the monarchy (by cutting the Civil List £7.9 million a year).

Notwithstanding, such a standpoint needs to be qualified. Indeed, one cannot disregard the fact that the monarchy has a unique influence in the whole world. All the more as it attracts tourists to see Buckingham Palace and the pageantry. 250 Furthermore, the monarchy makes it possible to create strong ties between the past and the present. Last but not least, the monarchy enables people to admire an abstract and unbiased institution. Finally, we are not absolutely sure that coming up with a Republic would be more efficient.
