Yet have so Mr Trump's trade tariffs really been effective?

First Donald Trump's goal was to make American citizens consume more products made in the US. He deemed that higher tariff rates

would hamper the importation of foreign goods on the American soil. Although many foreign companies have been quite deterred, they still ¹⁰⁰export their products in great amounts to// the US. Thus the way US citizens consume has not really changed. They do not tend to buy more products made in the US because, most of the time, these cost much more than foreign products. Citizens fear for the in-
¹⁵⁰creasing cost of living and are not ready to// buy the priciest products out of patriotism and turn their backs on the cheaper foreign option. Indeed it seems that Donald Trump's goal of boosting the country's economy by fostering made in US goods has not been met.

Second Donald Trump's goal was also to create more jobs for the American ²⁰⁰population//. He thought that higher tariff rates would incentivize American firms that had been locating their production units elsewhere to reshore their production in the US, thus creating more jobs for US citizens. But it seems that firms that reshore their production do it in neighbouring ²⁵⁰countries such as Mexico, where// the workforce is cheaper, rather than in the US.
